

Norms Peony Pride-P is atop the Living Lifetime Milk Producers list. "Pride" has produced 226,039 pounds of milk and 10,291 pounds of fat in 4,629 days. This averages to 48.8 pounds milk and 2.2 pounds fat produced daily. "Pride" is owned by Goodnow Jersey Farm, Inc., Albert and Lynette Bradford, Turner, Maine.

Deposit Victor Coleen, owned by the estate of J.W. Coppini, Ferndale, California, is the winner of the Leading Lifetime Fat Producers contest. "Coleen" has produced 11,213 pounds of fat and 186,260 pounds milk in 3,486 days. "Coleen" averaged 3.2 pounds fat and 53.4 pounds milk daily production.

"Pride" and "Coleen" received the Ogston Farm Trophy and the High Lawn Farm Trophy, respectively, at the 1989 American Jersey Cattle Club Awards Breakfast on June 17 in Cedar Rapids, lowa.

The 1988 Contest saw the first time in history that six entries had over 200,000 pounds milk. Additionally, four entries had lifetime credits over 10,000 pounds fat.
