Norms Peony Pride-P is atop the Living Lifetime Milk Producers list. "Pride" has produced 226,039 pounds of milk and 10,291 pounds of fat in 4,629 days. This averages to 48.8 pounds milk and 2.2 pounds fat produced daily. "Pride" is owned by Goodnow Jersey Farm, Inc., Albert and Lynette Bradford, Turner, Maine.

Deposit Victor Coleen, owned by the estate of J.W. Coppini, Ferndale, California, is the winner of the Leading Lifetime Fat Producers contest. "Coleen" has produced 11,213 pounds of fat and

186,260 pounds milk in 3,486 days. "Coleen" averaged 3.2 pounds fat and 53.4 pounds milk daily production.

"Pride" and "Coleen" received the Ogston Farm Trophy and the High Lawn Farm Trophy, respectively, at the 1989 American Jersey Cattle Club Awards Breakfast on June 17 in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

The 1988 Contest saw the first time in history that six entries had over 200,000 pounds milk. Additionally, four entries had lifetime credits over 10,000 pounds fat.

Kozak, Dreisbach and Haworth Join American Jersey Cattle Club

REYNOLDS, Oh. — The hiring of three new staff members has been announced by Maurice E. Core, Executive Secretary of The American Jersey Cattle Club (AJCC) and National All-Jersey Inc. (NAJ).

Alan Kozak, State College, Pennsylvania, has been named Southwest Area Representative effective August 1, 1989. Kozak will offer the services of AJCC and NAJ in California, Nevada, Arizona and New Mexico. Kozak is a 1984 graduate of The Pennsylvania State University and is currently the Business Manager of the Pennsylvania Guernsey Breeders Association.

Kozak coached the first place team at the 1988 National 4-H Dairy Cattle Judging Contest. He will accompany the team to Scotland to compete in an international dairy judging contest this summer.

Kozak spent two years as an Assistant County Agent for the Pennsylvania Cooperative Extension Service and has also worked at Co-Hill Farms, Twin Brook Farm and Misty Acres in each aspect of dairy operations.

While in college Kozak served

as president of Alpha Zeta Agricultural Fraternity and received many scholarships including the Craola Farm Scholarship. Alpha Zeta-Morrill Chapter Cooperation Scholarship, National Alpha Zeta Foundation Scholarship and the Milk Marketing, Inc. Scholarship.

Carol A. Dreisbach, Hamburg, Pennsylvania, was named Assistant Editor of the Jersey Journal. She will contribute to all aspects of Jersey Journal production including editorial and advertising material beginning July 1, 1989.

Dreisbach is a May, 1989 graduate of The Pennsylvania State University, where she majored in Dairy Production and minored in English. An active member of the Penn State Dairy Science Club, Dreisbach was co-editor of the 1988 Penn State Dairyman Yearbook and sophomore representative to the Agriculture Student Council. As a member of the Dairy Judging Team at Penn State, she was the high individual and high oral reason presenter at the Penn State Spring Judging Contest, placed fifth at the Eastern States Exposition Collegiate Contest, and placed ninth at the Pennsylvania All-American Contest.

Carol is the daughter of Dr. Robert and Mrs. Helene Dreisbach, and was actively involved in the family's Long Meadows Farm Jersey operation.

Larry Haworth, Manteca, California, is the new Northwest Area Representative and will provide AJCC and NAJ services for Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Utah, Montana, Wyoming and Colorado.

Haworth is a June, 1989 graduate of California Polytechnic University where he majored in Dairy Science and minored in Agricultural Business Management.

Haworth was an assistant herdsman for nine years at Dutra Farms, Inc., where he assisted in milking, caring and feeding of the 1,100 cows. He has been a creamery assistant at the Cal Poly Creamery since 1987 and a sweet corn grower at the Cal Poly Sweet Corn Enterprise Project.
