Scott Grubb conducted the business meeting and reported that the skating party was a big success. Barbeque tickets for the Lebanon

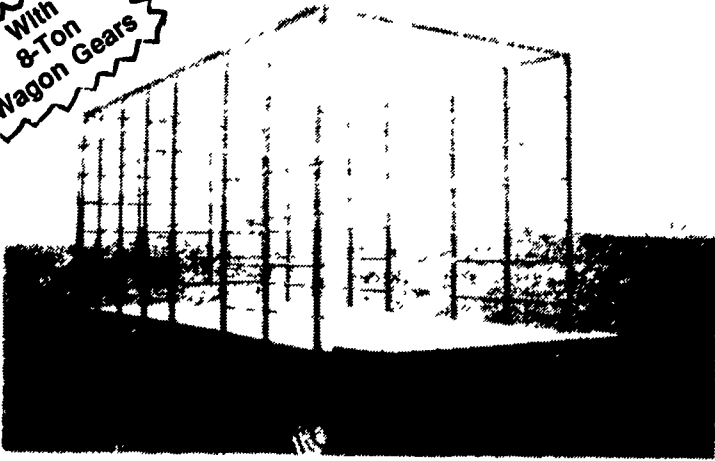

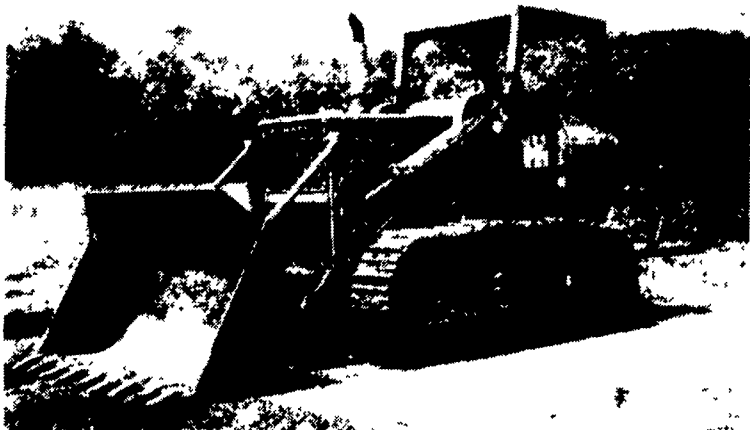
