Acres Cattle Update: Live cattle futures futures closed from 78 to 128 points higher while feeders closed from 5 lower to 27 higher on the front option. Today's session was extremely volatile with August trading in a 148 point range. Weakness this morning was tied to follow through selling from Monday's close and continued concerns over sluggish boxed beef movement and fed cattle sales. Prices were mostly lower midday with the unexpected burst in buying catching many participants by surprise. Some support was tied to USDA reports of active fed sales at steady to \$ .50 higher levels. Further pressure this morning was tied to limit gains in the corn pit and spillover from the hog pig. CME FEEDER SETTLEMENT PRICE: Unquoted

NEXT DAY OUTLOOK: CASH PRICES - steady to weak FUTURES steady to mixed.

Acres Hog Update: Live hogs closed from 52 higher on the June to limit lower on the August option while pork bellies settled limit lower on the front four options. Follow through sales from yesterday's limit losses started the session sharply lower with further pressure attributed to limit gains in the corn. Additio nal pressure was attributed to weaker cash markets coupled with the prospects for additional weakening this week in response to seasonal trends. July closed out today's session at only a 2 point loss with losses pared by the discount to cash. Continued long liquidation in response to the USDA Hos and Pig report plagued the pork bellies with limit losses.




