the month following the end of any calendar quarter in which the FUTA tax liability reaches \$100. Form 940 is required annually, by January 31, for wages paid in the preceding year.

State Unemployment Tax

The Commonwealth of PA imposes an unemployment tax on agricultural employers who are subject to FUTA. The rate for an

employer initially subject to the tax is 3.5 percent and applies to the first \$8000 of wages paid to each employee. Experience ratings are earned after the initial year and can range from 1.5 percent to 9.7 percent. The tax is reported to the Bureau of Employment Security using form UC-2 and is due for wages paid during

the calendar quarter on the last day of the following month. State Unemployment taxes apply to the employer and may NOT be deducted from an employees earnings.

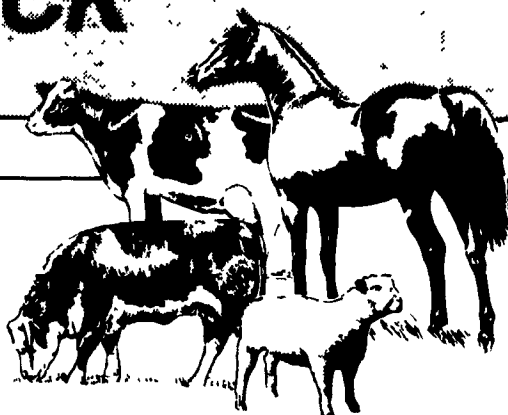
The exhibits will include a large outdoor and indoor flea market, antique farm machinery, steam engines, horses, tractors, gas engines and quilt display.

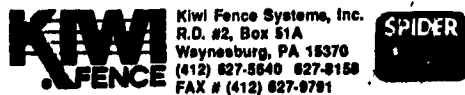
