Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 58-70 cents. Live supplies were adequate with average weights on the light side of desirable. Today's slaughter schedules were heavy, The trade sentiment was steady but cautious.

National Egg Market July 5, 1989

The market tone was generally steady. Cartoned egg movement was quite irregular around the nation. The best movement was usually reported in resort areas and where promotions stimulated some additional buyer interest. Supplies though closely cleared in some sections were for the most part sufficient to satisfy dealers needs. Breakers were cautious and usually had adequate stocks for their limited work ing schedules.

The trade sentiment was barely steady to weak. Offers from producers have increased over prior week but were still short of trade needs. Buyers were cautious and bid at lower price levels. Most processing plants will operate only three days this week. Demand for canner pack product was generally fair at prices mostly unchanged to down one cent.
