MARKETS IN REVIEW; JULY 6-12, 1989. FEEDER STEERS AND HEIFERS IN VIRGINIA WERE UNEVEN \$3.00 LOWER TO 2.25 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$1.00 HIGHER.

SLAUGHTER STEERS AND HEIFERS IN VIRGINIA WERE \$.50-1.25 LOWER. MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$.50-1.50 LOWER.

COWS AND BULLS IN VIRGINIA WERE \$.50-\$4.00 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$.50-1.00 LOWER. BEEF PRODUCTION WAS 15% BELOW A WEEK AGO AND 7% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 1 POUND HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.

VEAL AND CALF PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE UNEVEN \$1.00 LOWER TO \$5.00 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY. VEAL AND CALF PRODUCTION WAS 20% BELOW A WEEK AGO AND 20% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 29 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.

LAMB PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE \$.50-1.00 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$2.00-TO 6.00 LOWER. LAMB PRODUCTION WAS 6% BELOW A WEEK AGO AND 17% ABOVE A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE THE SAME AS LAST YEAR.

SLAUGHTER HOG PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE \$.50 TO \$1.50 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE MOSTLY \$1.00 HIGHER. FRESH PORK PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$8.00 HIGHER PORK PRODUCTION WAS 17% BELOW LAST WEEK AND 6% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 1 POUND HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.

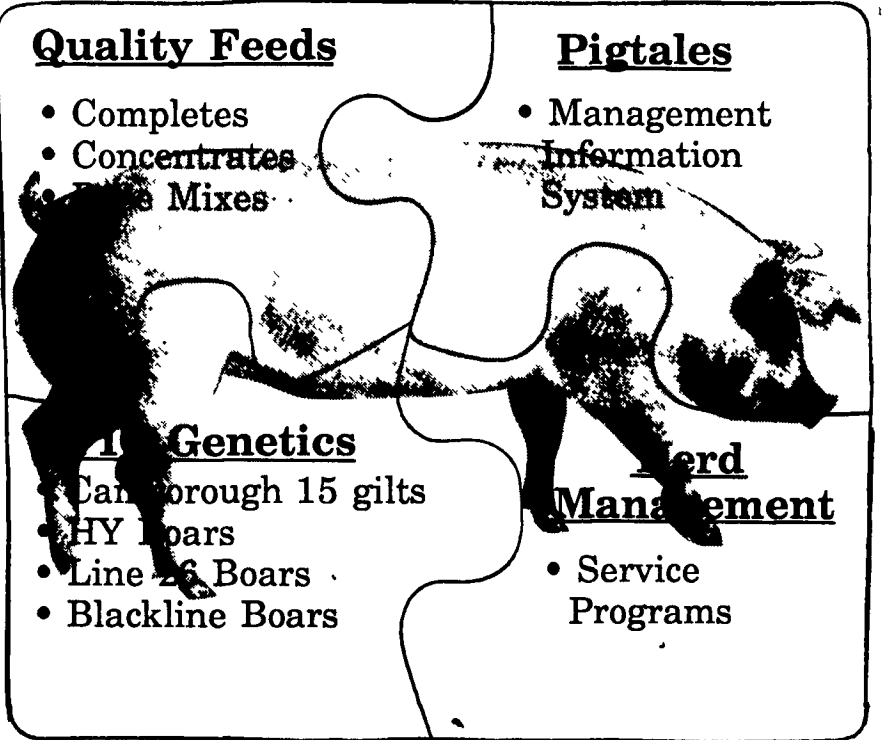
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
