ACRES WHEAT UPDATE: Wheat futures prices continued lower today, ending the session from 3-1/2 to 5-1/4 cents lower. Pressure was exerted by late fund selling tied to reports of an increased harvest pace and bearish technical factors. Buyers were absent in advance of this afternoon's production report, which showed production at 1.462 billion bushels and was termed bearish by traders and analysis. The estimate of the hard red crop at 708.5 million bushels was sharply higher from the June estimated of 682 million bushels. Many had expected declines and were surprised by today's figures. Ending stocks showed an increase from 500 million bushels to 592 million with projections for a prices to drop tomorrow from 2 to 4 cents on the opening.

ACRES CATTLE UPDATE: Live and feeder cattle added to yesterday's gains and closed higher from 15 to 60 on the fats and 20 to 80 on the feeders. Trading throughout the day was light with buying tied to ideas that supplies would be limited longer term. Feeders were propped by reports of higher cash prices at auction barns for replacement cattle. Central Carlot beef trade was unquoted on the yield grade 3 choice steers weighing 600 to 900 lbs

ACRES HOG UPDATE: Live hog futures closed mixed today

with the front three options lower from 20 to 33 points while the December gained 20 points and the February dropped 12. Today's session was choppy with volume light. Support early in the day was attributed to hopes for stabilizing cash markets and expectations for firmer midday product. Reports of lower cash prices and lower midday quotes dropped futures with August and October reaching contract lows. Bellies were mostly lower in lackluster activity on pressure from declining fresh belly prices.


