Conservation Tillage Expo Set For August

NEWARK, DE — Delaware farmers are leaders in innovative tillage techniques. In 1988, Delaware had 23 percent of its agronomic crops planted in no-till and 67 percent of agronomic crops in conservation tillage, according to the Conservation Technology Information Center.

The Delaware No-till Council is sponsoring a field exposition in Felton on August 10, 1989, to demonstrate conservation production techniques for field crops.

On display at the expo will be corn, soybeans and sorghum planted conventionally, no-till and ridge-till. Demonstrations of the newest conservation tillage equipment also will be an integral part of the program.

In addition, farmers who are adopting innovative conservation tillage techniques will be available to answer questions during the expo, scheduled from 8:30 a.m. to noon.

To get to the William's farm from Route 13, turn east on Felton-Fredericka Rd. (#12). The farm is at the corner of Felton-Fredericka Rd. and Canterbury

Rd. (#15) and will be marked by a blinking traffic light and an expo sign.

The Delaware No-till Council was formed in 1985 to encourage development of no-till farming in the state. It serves as an educational and support group for growers, industry, the University of Delaware and Delaware State College as well as county, state and federal regulatory and service agencies.

All expo attendees are invited to join a trip on the Delaware Bay to fish for sea trout and flounder. The boat will be boarded at the Tradewinds Dock at North Bowers Beach at 2:30 p.m. Food and beverage will be provided on the boat, which will return to the dock at 8 p.m.

Tickets are available for \$18. Interested parties may register by August 1, at any county Extension office in Delaware. Mail registrations are being accepted by Delaware No-till Council, c/o University of Delaware Research and Education Center, RD#2, Box 48, Georgetown, DE 19947.
