VERY LITTLE EXPORT DEMAND ALSO A FACTOR IN PRICE DECLINES. SOYBEANS DROPPED SHARPLY AS NEARBY CONTRACTS ARE BEING LIQUIDATED.

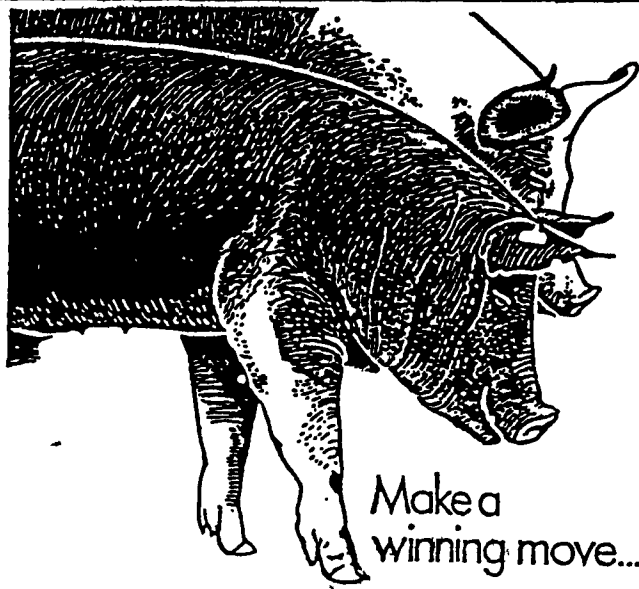
