MARKETS IN REVIEW; JULY 13-19, 1989. FEEDER STEERS IN VIRGINIA WERE MOSTLY STEADY AS FEEDER HEIFERS IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$1.00 HIGHER. FEEDER CATTLE IN THE MIDWEST WERE MIXED, STEADY TO \$3.00 HIGHER IN MOST AREAS, BUT STOCKER CALVES WERE STEADY TO \$2.00 LOWER IN SOME AUCTIONS.

SLAUGHTER STEERS AND HEIFERS IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$1.00 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE 50 CENT TO \$2.00 LOWER.

COWS AND BULLS IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$2.00 LOWER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$1.00 HIGHER. BEEF PRODUCTION WAS 19% ABOVE A WEEK AGO BUT 6% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 3 POUND HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.
