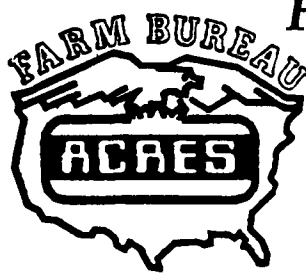

## FUTURES MARKET TRENDS GRAIN AND LIVESTOCK

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**Acres Corn Update:** Corn futures prices closed from 3/4 cent higher to 1/4 cent lower today after a fairly lackluster session. September settled slightly higher on buying attributed to an increase in near term exports with Mexico buying 120,000 metric tonnes. Further support was tied to news that Turkey and South Korea were in the market also along with firming basis levels. Ideas that the market had become oversold prompted some short covering with gains held in check by ideal growing conditions. September settled today at \$2.29-1/2 after trading in a range from \$2.28-1/2 to \$2.31-3/4. Bids for generic certificates continued firm on strong buyer interest.

**Acres Soybean Update:** Soybean futures prices ended the day mixed

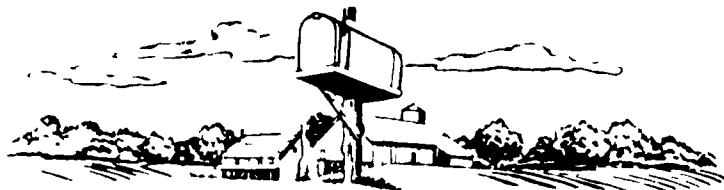
with old crop higher on aggressive processor demand. New contract lows were made again today in the new crop months with November trading to a low of \$5.95 on continued weather driven selling. New crop buying early in the day was in response to active European trading and oversold indicators. Rumors of strong cash basis levels fueled buying in the old crop options after talk that Decatur was paying November + \$1.00 for spot deliveries. August settled 3/4 cent higher at \$6.61-3/4 after trading in a range from \$6.61 to \$6.73.

**Acres Wheat Update:** Wheat futures prices staged a reversal today and closed higher from 2 to 6 cents. Buying early in the day was tied to short covering coupled with ideas that recent losses were

overdone. September encountered strong technical resistance at \$3.90 and settled 2 cents higher for the day at \$3.88-1/4 after trading in a range from \$3.86-1/2 to \$3.90-3/4. December traded to a high of \$4.03, where a double top was formed on the charts, and eased back down to \$4.00-3/4 on the close. Trading throughout the day was sluggish with moves exaggerated by thin volume.

**Acres Cattle Update:** Live and feeder cattle futures closed mixed this afternoon with fats closing from 40 higher on the August and October options to 15 lower on the April while feeders dropped 15 points on the August and gained 30 on the October. Nearby months were propped by short covering and the establishment of

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
