

Champion Livestock Sale Date Set For Schuylkill County Fair

Lebanon County 4-H Auction Set

SCHUYLKILL HAVEN (Schuylkill Co.) — The 4-H and F.F.A. Champion Livestock Sale will highlight the Saturday night schedule of events of the 1989 Schuylkill County Fair. The sale begins at 6:00 p.m. on August 12. This sale is the culmination of much hard work by the young people who undertook a steer, hog, or lamb project. The animals are required to be sold at the fair auction. Bids generally exceed market price which rewards the 4-H or

F.F.A. youth for their many hours spent training and grooming their animals for the show. Area businessmen and other generous individuals support the sale with their bids and make it a success. As a preview to the sale, a "Parade of Champions" will be conducted Friday, August 11, at 7:00 p.m. Owners and experts will be on hand to explain why these champions were judged best of the fair. Judy Flynn, Fair Livestock Co-Superintendent, says, "Every year

since the rebirth of the Schuylkill County Fair, we have received higher bids and set new records at the 4-H and F.F.A. livestock sale. The August 12 sale at the new fairgrounds in Summit Station promises to be the best champion livestock sale ever!" The 1989 Schuylkill County Fair will be held August 7 thru August 12 and features a wide range of amusements and entertainment in addition to the livestock events.

Delaware State Fair To Feature Water Quality Booths

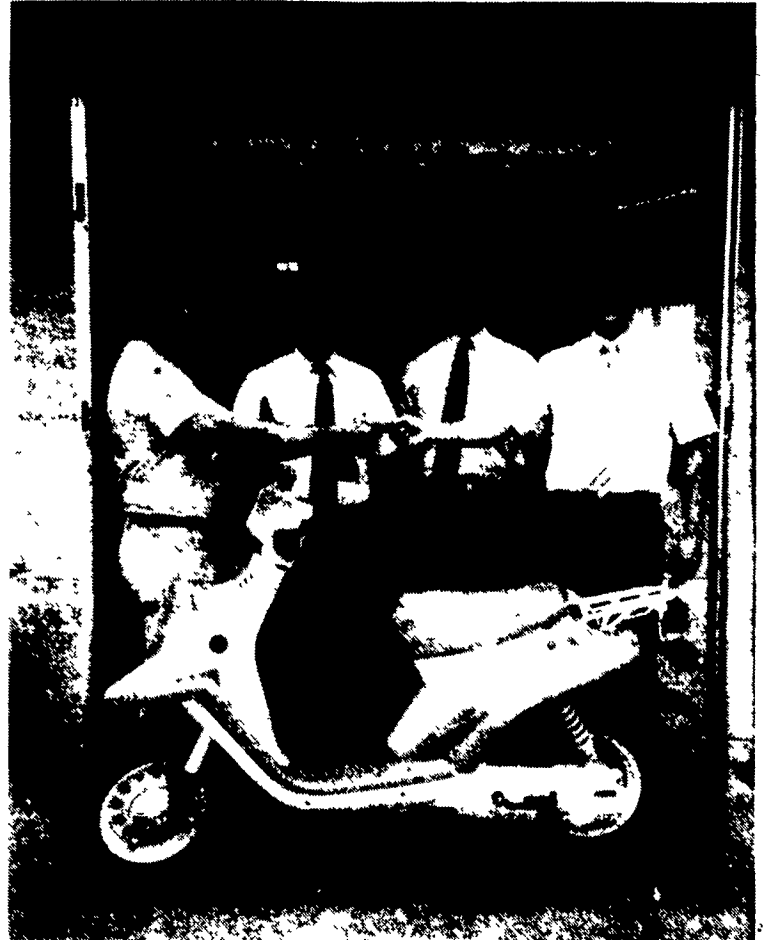
NEWARK, DE — University of Delaware Cooperative Extension is again planning a tent full of fun and education at the Delaware State Fair, July 20-29. Groundwater safety will be a key feature in this year's tent. A computer game will test visitors' knowledge of the subject. A groundwater model will graphically demonstrate the course that water takes from fields and homes into the underground holding areas.



"Groundwater quality is a national issue of wide public interest," says Tom Williams, University of Delaware Extension agricultural engineer. "Fair goers would do well to stop by the tent and get more information on protecting groundwater quality. Specialists will be there to answer questions and concerns about water quality." Williams says the tent will include exhibits on where to get your water tested for nitrates and bacteria, water treatment systems,

non-profit source pollution and household hazardous waste disposal. Also featured will be a home greenhouse display staffed by Delaware Master Gardeners. The gardeners are planning to showcase nine unusual plants in addition to displaying a water conservation landscape. Food is always an intriguing topic, especially at the Extension tent. Visitors can test their know-

ledge of food safety at an electric quizboard, while children participate in a ball toss. As an added bonus for tent visitors, extension will give away free tickets to a University of Delaware Football game daily. Extension is celebrating its 75th Anniversary this year. To celebrate this important anniversary, a collection of photos tracing Extension's history will be exhibited in the 4-H building.
