## Voss Dominates Delaware State Fair Holstein Show

HARRINGTON, De. — The weather at the State Fair is always hot and humid on show day and this year was no exception. Despite this, the avid dairy showmen came with the type and quality of animals the state show is known to have each year.

Judge Jimmy Eutace from Willowlyn Farms of Catlett, Virginia, had his work cut out for him as 50 exhibitors paraded over 90 Holsteins in the ring for his inspection.

Norman Voss, Jr. from Clayton had an outstanding day as his show string brought him first place blue ribbons in 13 out of the 17 classes. The junior, senior and grand champion female rosettes were also his. His first place 3-year-old cow Vossmon Tempo Gloria-Twin took the top honors winning the Grand Champion Female.

"She is a well balanced cow, displaying upstandingness, strength and a fine udder," said Judge Eutace. Her herd mate C Kenya Mattador Cindy, Norman's first place 4-year-old, was the reserve grand Champion.

Vossmon Astro Jet Carly, was the junior champion of the show. This senior heifer calf is a Bridon Astro Jet-et daughter out of Vossmon Sherm Charity. Charles Dean, Jr. received the reserve junior champion ribbon with his first place junior yearling, Dean-C-T Enhancer Kate.

**Colored Breed Show** 

Judge Johnny Morris from Maryland had the honors to judge the colored breeds. Over 75 animals from 27 exhibitors came into the ring for him to place. In the Ayrshire show Wallace and Grace Caulk from Woodside received the grand champion rosette. Their first place 2-year-old and senior champion, Exchange Julius Juliette, placed on top. The aged cow owned by Becky and Cindy Bell was the reserved grand champion of the show. Andrew Webb took the junior champion honors. His first place intermediate heifer calf, Del Acres Vag Kit, placed over the reserve junior champion owned by Leslie Jane Moore.

The Jersey show was dominated by Patricia and Elizabeth Jenkins from Toughkenamon, Pennsylvania. Their show string nearly placed first in all the classes as well as placing on top of the show. Their first and second place 3-year-olds were grand and reserved grand respectively.

CLV Faithful Golden Farina and CLV Faithful Golden Gigi are both paternal sisters out of the Golden Faithful sire. The Jenkins' also won the reserve junior champion ribbon. The first-place senior yearling heifer owned by Danny Severson from Mid-Del Jerseys, Dover, Delaware took the junior champion spot.

The University of Delaware brought their best Guernsey cows to the fair and it showed as they took home blue ribbons in all of the group classes as well as 6 of the 11 individual classes.

Their first place dry cow and 2-year-old cow won the grand and reserve grand champion honors respectively. U of D Nobleman Rozanna and U of D Fayette Bonnie also won the senior and reserve senior ribbons as well.

The University also won the reserve junior champion rosette.


