First 305 Days Of Lactation With 750 Or More Lbs. Of Butterfat.

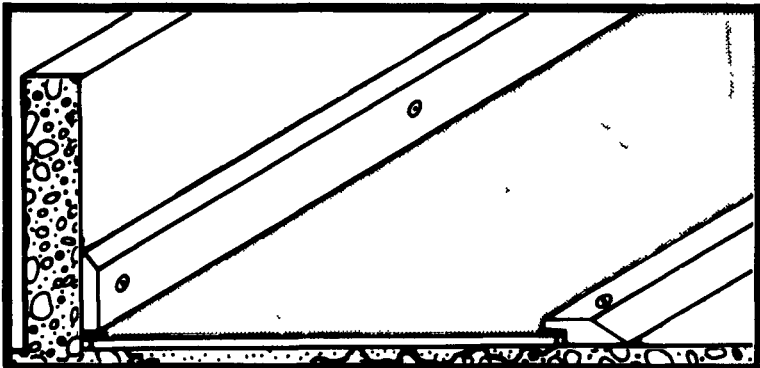

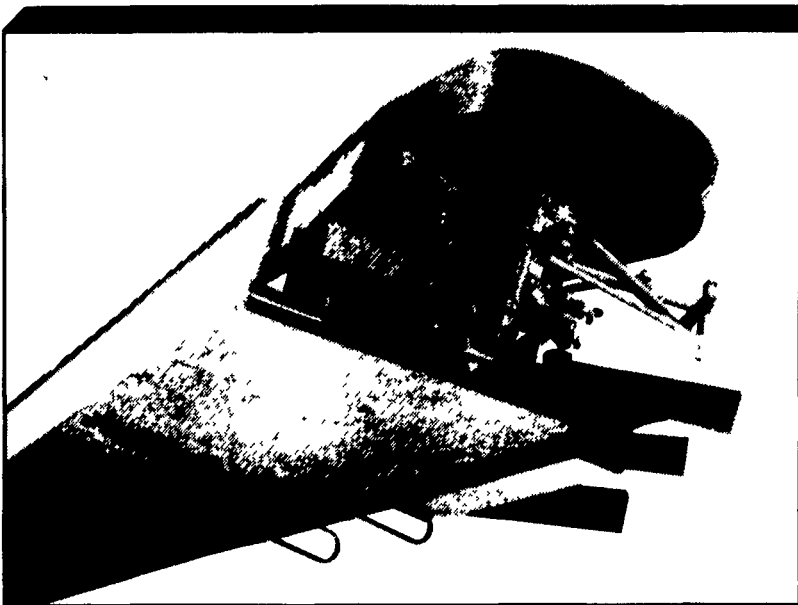

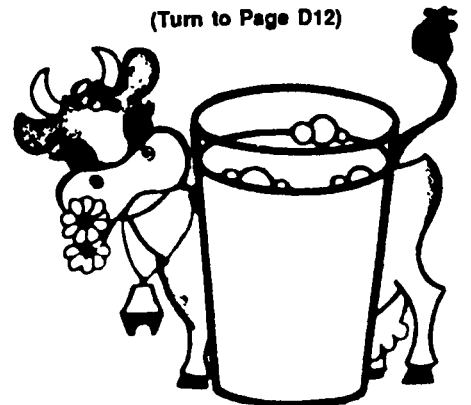
