HARRISONBURG, VA. — Young exhibitors from across the state led out some 92-head of Angus cattle at the 1989 Virginia Junior Angus Breeders Show held here. Albert Epperly of Bedford served as judge and he placed cattle in divisions for bred-and-owned heifers, 'owned' heifers, bred-and-owned bulls, cow/calf pairs and steers.

Steve Craig, Middlebrook, displayed the bred-and-owned grand champion female. Genetta 2 Windy Cove 86 earlier won the intermediate ribbon. This heifer is a

June 1988 daughter of Broadway. Scott Updike, Washington, bred and exhibited the bred-and-owned reserve grand champion female. Proud Lady of Skyway Hills, a March 1988, Pine Drive Big Sky daughter, also stood as the junior champion.

In the 'owned' heifer division, Sarah Hill of Forest exhibited both the grand and reserve grand champions. Her grand champion female was Northcote Abbie. This January 1988, Cobble Pond Rookie daughter captured the junior title, also. Sarah's senior calf win-

ner, Northcote Exciting Erica won the reserve grand ribbon. This heifer was calved September 1988 and was sired by Northcote Excitement.

John Hausner, The Plains, paraded the bred-and-owned grand champion bull. Byrnley Lone Rider 7158 is a July 1988 son of Wrangler. WMS Connecting Stutch took home the bred-and-owned reserve grand champion bull banner for William Federspiel, Powhatan. This bull was calved June 1988 and was sired by B&L Stutch 6183.

Pride of Skyway Hills and her April heifer calf, sired by Skyway Hills Big Time, were named the grand champion cow/calf. They were shown by Scott Updike. The reserve grand champion cow/calf rosette went to Annes Miss Georgina 54 and her January, R&J Taurus 1186 heifer calf. This pair was exhibited by Anne Jones, Forest.

Susan Belford, White Post, showed the champion market steer, as well as the champion feeder steer. Adam Kauf, Boyce, led out the reserve champion market steer and Andy McIntire,

White Post, exhibited the reserve champion feeder steer.

The junior herdsman award went to Chan Smith of Lovettsville.

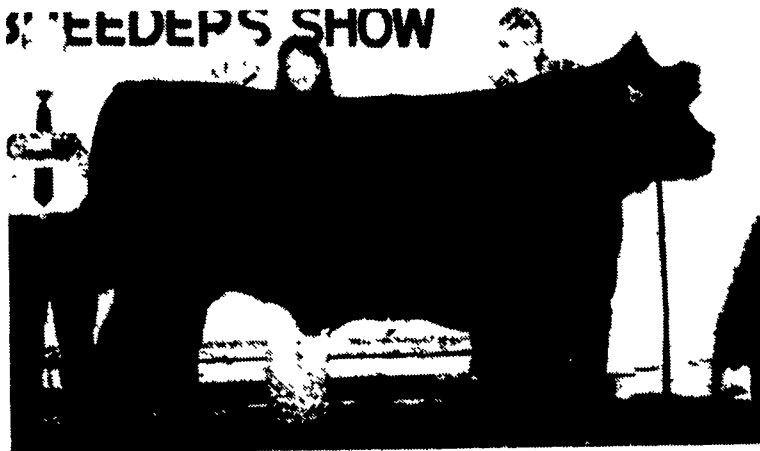

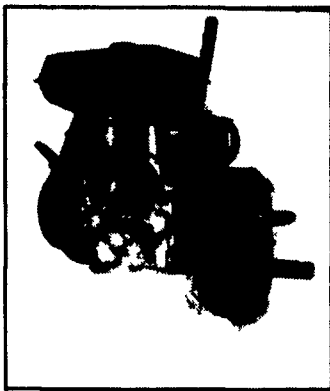

8 1/2 HP Kawasaki Gasoline Engine
 With Clutch & 6 to 1 Reduction



Specially designed shaft to power hydraulic pumps, etc.

This unit is basically designed to transmit power from engine to power take off shaft equipment. The reason for this design, an extra shaft is built into this unit so power can be transmitted to the hydraulic system by using belts and pulleys. This shaft is placed above the splined shaft, and runs hydraulic pump with or without power take off shaft in gear. No need to take the rope rewind starter off to mount pulley on front of the engine. This simple design eliminates special machined pulley adaptors. Reduction housing and cover is a rugged cast iron construction. All shafts are of special selected steels and are heat treated and hardened at wear points. All ball and needle bearing construction for long life. A heavy-duty ball-loc type clutch is used. This unit has few moving parts, thus it should give many years of service. Clutch adjustments are made from the outside, (very simple)

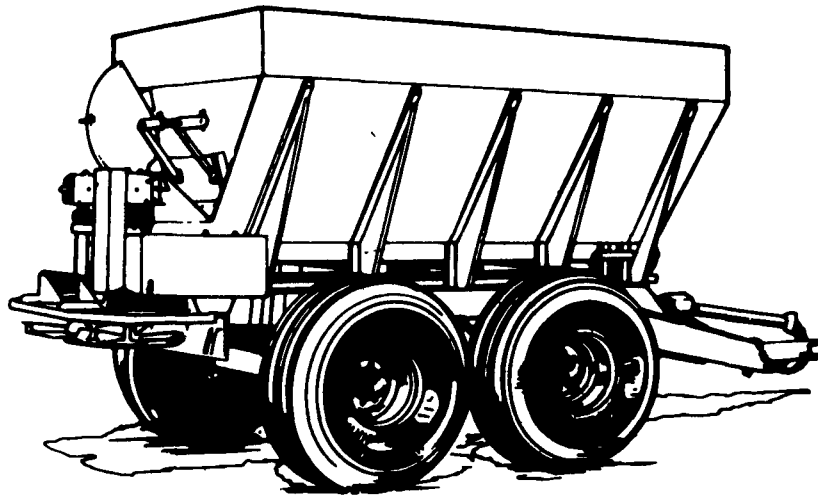
