ACRES HOG UPDATE: Live hog futures settled higher this afternoon from 15 to 52 points on short covering and spillover from the pork belly pit. Prices also found support from expectations for steady to higher midday values with gains held in check by cash market weakness. Bellies were higher on short covering and technical buying attributed to increased user demand and expectations for firmer wholesale prices. Bellies settled limit higher in the February through July options and gained 195 points on the August. August hogs settled 18 higher at \$47.15 after trading in a range from \$46.85 to \$47.20.

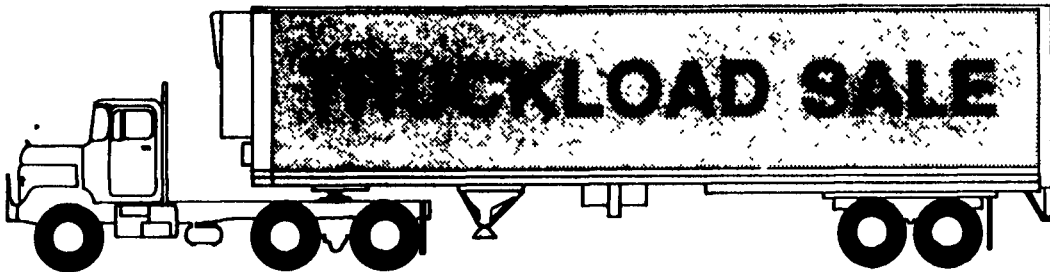

- (2) Do not cut tobacco too young - make sure good & ripe
- (3) Do not hang tobacco too close in barn - especially this year
- (4) Hang tobacco in north or west end of barn first. Try to fill a section full as moisture will rise from hanging green tobacco under partly cured tobacco.
- (5) Close barn in damp weather - open in dry weather. Remember quality tobacco commands top prices & quality is largely determined at harvesting & barning.

Call us if you have any tobacco news in the field. Let's work together this year to make it the most exciting tobacco year yet!
