ACRES CORN UPDATE: Corn futures prices ended today's session from 1/2 cent lower on the September 1990 option to 1-1/2 cents higher on the December. Volume was thin again today as participants awaited fresh fundamental-news. Some buying was linked to ideas that recent rainfall was not sufficient for kernal development in parts of the western belt with prices stalled by long liquidation and reports of weaker basis levels. Support was also linked to a brighter export outlook. September settled 3/4 of a

cent higher this afternoon at \$2.35 after trading in a range from \$2.32-1/2 to \$2.35-3/4. Bids for generic certificates were slightly weaker.

ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE: Soybean futures prices ended today's session mostly lower as the latest weather forecasters predicted weekend rainfall. Further sales were attributed to locals who were offsetting short positions. August closed 1 cent higher after trading as much as 13 cents higher on strength from the CIF market

as farmers continued to hang on to old crop supplies. November settled 12 cents lower at \$5.72-1/2 after trading in a range from \$5.72 to \$5.87.

ACRES WHEAT UPDATE: Wheat futures prices closed mixed this afternoon with the September settling unchanged as the December posted a 1/4 cent loss. May gained 4-3/4 cents and with the July and September 1990 options higher by 3 and 3-1/2 cents respectively. Price support was
