ment's extension programs. He
has been involved in many exten-
sion related activities in
Pennsylvania.

Named to the Penn State faculty
as an assistant professor in 1972,
he was promoted to associate pro-
fessor in 1975 and to full professor
in 1980. His research efforts
focused on nutrition and metabo-
lism in farm and laboratory ani-
mals. His experiments helped
explain how body mechanisms
such as hormones control appetite
and affect the rate and composi-
tion of tissue growth. He also

taught undergraduate and gradu-
ate courses in nutritional bioche-
mistry, physiology and applied
nutrition. His findings have been
published in over 50 refereed jour-
nal articles and include work with
rats, sheep, cattle and swine.

He won the Young Scientist
Award in 1982 from the Northeast
American Society of Animal
Science.

Wangness earned his bachelor
of science degree in agriculture-
dairy science from the University
of Wisconsin and his doctorate in
animal nutrition and physiology
from Iowa State University.

Two scholarships were

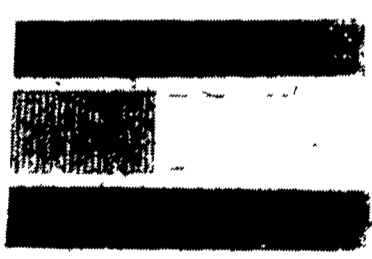
awarded to attend the State Con-

applications.



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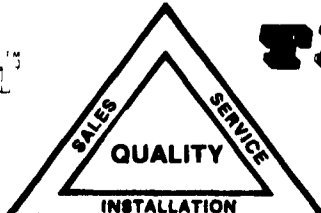


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
