Plowing And Grange Picnic

YORK — During late August, the towns of Manchester, Mount Wolf and surrounding East Manchester Townships will come alive with festivities. "The National Plowing Contest, OLDE TYME DAYS '89 and the 116th Great Grangers Picnic - A Combined Celebration" will be held Thursday, August 24 through Sunday, August 27. Many activities including national competitions will take place on the Blain Rentzel Farm and two adjoining farms totaling over 200 acres. Friday, August 25, is Grange Day. Hundreds of Grange families are expected to attend the traditional festival.

The South Central Penn Historic Lifestyle and Power Society, annual sponsor of OLDE TYME DAYS, will be hosting the 116th Great Grangers Picnic as well as several national and state plowing contests. To help defray the costs of this enormous celebration, a two-dollar admission will be requested. All of the hosting organizations are non-profit organizations. Free camping facilities are available; however there are no hook-ups.

Thursday, August 24, the York County Plowing competition starting at 9:30 a.m., with the Pennsylvania State Contest at 11:30 a.m., the State Antique Class competition at 2:00 p.m., followed by the state awards ceremony at 4:00 p.m. In the evening, the National Plowing Contest Banquet will be held at 7:00.

Friday, August 25 is Grangers Day, and will see the start of the National Contest with competitors from across the United States. The small plow division will start at 10:00 a.m., the big boys of the large plow division at noon, followed by an awards presentation at 3:00 p.m. Also scheduled at 10 a.m. is competitive horse plowing along with entertainment to cap the day's events.


Saturday will build excitement, as more than forty contestants battle it out in the National Antique Class plowing contest beginning at 10:00 a.m. and finishing in


The public is invited to attend the Olde Tyme Church Service on Sunday morning, August 27. There will be country music and horse pulling contests later in the day.


