WEEKLY REVIEW IN VIRGINIA MARKETS IN REVIEW: AUGUST 10-16, 1989. FEEDER STEERS AND HEIFERS IN VIRGINIA WERE MIXED \$2.00 LOWER TO \$4.00 HIGHER WHILE MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$8.25-9.00 HIGHER.

SLAUGHTER STEERS AND HEIF-ERS IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$3.00 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE 50 CENT HIGHER TO \$4.00 LOWER.

COWS AND BULL PRICES IN VIR-GINIA WERE MOSTLY \$1.50-3,50 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO 50 CENT LOWER. BEEF PRODUCTION WAS 3% ABOVE A WEEK AGO BUT 3% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 3 POUNDS LIGHTER THAN A YEAR AGO.

VEAL AND CALF PRICES IN VIRGI-NIA WERE STEADY FOLLOWING MIDWEST PRICES WHICH WERE ALSO STEADY. VEAL AND CALF PRODUCTION WAS 1% BELOW A WEEK AGO AND 15% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 12 POUNDS HEA-VIER THAN LAST YEAR.

LAMB PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE 75 CENT TO \$1.00 HIGHER AS MID-WEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$1.00 HIGHER. LAMB PRODUCTION WAS 5% ABOVE A WEEK AGO AND 9% ABOVE A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 1 POUND LIGHTER THAN LAST YEAR.
