Leading the pack for the men was Todd Miller of Hamburg, closely followed by David Pool, 147; David Schuler, the club's

Martha Heffner, Kutztown, was the top judge for the ladies followed by Barbara Bicksler, 146.5; Phoebe Bittler, 146, Barbara Lentz, 143.5; Kathy Schantz, 143, and Barbara Richard, 142.

Martha's daughter, Lynette took the top judging honors in the youth division followed by Chris Wagner, 146, David Lentz, 142.5, Dwight Stoltzfus, 142. Kirk Sattazahn, 141 and Jennifer Neiman, 140.
