MARKETS IN REVIEW; AUGUST 17-23, 1989. FEEDER STEERS AND HEIFERS IN VIRGINIA WERE \$3.00-4.00 LOWER ON STEERS AND 50 CENT TO \$4.00 HIGHER ON HEIFERS AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$8.50-9.00 LOWER.

SLAUGHTER STEERS AND HEIF-ERS IN VIRGINIA WERE \$2.50-8.00 LOWER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE
50 CENT TO \$3.75 LOWER.
COWS AND BULL PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE \$1.00-2.25 LOWER AS

MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$2.00 LOW-ER. BEEF PRODUCTION WAS 3% BELOW A WEEK AGO AND 6% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE THE SAME AS LAST YEAR.

VEAL AND CALF PRICES IN VIRGI-NIA WERE MOSTLY STEADY FOL-LOWING MIDWEST PRICES WHICH WERE ALSO STEADY WITH A GOOD DEMAND IN THE MEAT TRADE. VEAL AND CALF PRODUCTION WAS 2% BELOW A WEEK AGO AND 16% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 4 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.

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
