Judge Genie Francisco was quite impressed with the big animal. "She is a tall animal with the best udder in the show. She has very correct legs and tracks well. She also shows cleanliness around the hocks," she said. An Bast is a Straight-Pine Elevation Pete daughter bred by Preston Trask.

Francisco followed the fiveyear-old with a dry four-year-old, Keystone Dynamo Denise. Bred by W. Douglas Seipt of Keystone Farm, Denise was also named the best bred and owned animal at the show. Denise was sired by Donacres Dynamo-Twin. Her dam was Keystone Pete Dottie-ET. Francisco was impressed with the cow's stylishness despite the fact that she was not in milk for the

In the youth division Daview Pete Ginger, a senior three-year-old belonging to Jeffrey Davis of Leesport, won another grand championship. Ginger, a junior champion at the Pennsylvania Farm Show two years ago, was the most correct looking cow in the youth show, according to Francisco.

Patricia Miller's seven-yearold, M-Maplegrove Valiant Melone-ET, received reserve honors. Melone, named the best 4-H animal in the state two years ago, won the 100,000-lb. class, and milked 110,000 lbs. as of her last lactation.

Penn Gate Enhancer Flashie, an

intermediate yearling, was tops in the junior show much to the pleasure of her owners Steve and Chris Wood. "She could be a reserve All-Pennsylvania selection," Steve added. Coredale Holsteins picked up the reserve with Coredale Steady Jodee, an intermediate calf.

In the youth division, Lebanon County Dairy Princess Kynel Bomgardner was thrilled to have the junior champion, Loving Meadows Mint, a senior calf. "My dad is judging in Perry County today and he said not to be too disappointed if we didn't win anything. He'll sure be surprised," she said. Kynel's father Nelson, bred the animal. 
