cents while the July 1990 option dropped 2-1/2 cents. Commercial and fund buying late in the session propped the September after a dull and featureless session. Spread trading was featured with many commission houses bear spreading against the December. Narrow range trading was dominant. Ideas that deliveries tomorrow against the September contract would range from 6 to 10 million bushels provided support. September settled today at \$3.85-3/4 after trading in a range from \$3.82-1/2 to \$3.86-1/2.

ACRES CATTLE UPDATE: Feeder and live cattle closed mostly lower under pressure from cash-connected selling prompted by ideas that yesterday's rally was overdone. Ongoing concerns over heavy fed cattle weights and sluggish boxed beef sales at lower prices added further pressure. Morning price gains were fueled by follow through from yesterday and an increase in open interest. Further buying was in response to the news that Japan would open a tender next month for 8,000 metric tonnes of frozen beef. Feeders came under pressure from losses in the live cattle pit.

ACRES HOG UPDATE: Hog futures gave back Tuesday's gains and closed lower today from 5 to 90 points. Session long weakness was tied to lower cash market quotations and reports of continued heavy receipts in most locations. Slaughter today was reported at 326,000 which compares with 309,000 last week and 304,000 last year. Bellies closed slightly higher, but well off session highs as long liquidation and profittaking. Further selling was fueled by ideas that fresh belly prices had reached a near term top and by spillover weakness from live hogs.






