

Second National Egg Producer Survey Completed

LANCASTER (Lancaster Co.) — Pennsylvania egg producers have completed their second national producer survey. This survey was a follow-up to the opinion survey, which drew responses from 60 percent of the producers representing 90 percent of the nation's production.

The first survey showed a significant interest in pursuing a national effort to stabilize egg prices. The second survey, developed by Penn State University, was aimed at determining the level of financial commitment that producers would pledge. The survey also asked producers who they believed could best represent the producer's interest.

Based upon the returns, approximately 26 percent of the 1,600 surveyed responded. About 66 percent still indicated a national effort was appropriate. Of those favoring a national effort, 86 percent of the producers representing

66 million birds, would be willing to pay one cent per bird to a national program development. These producers prefer to pay on installment tied to the program's progress and to a specific financial

goal. Fifty percent felt that two cents per dozen was appropriate. An additional 34 percent indicate funding should be from one to five cents per dozen.


