WHEAT HIGHER, CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES LOWER ON TUESDAY. RECENT GOOD EXPORT ORDERS AND REPORTS THAT CHINA HAS PURCHASED MORE WHEAT SUPPORTED PRICES. CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES DECLINED AS FOREIGN DEMAND WEIGHED ON PRICES. RAINFALL OVER THE MIDWEST IMPROVED LATE SOYBEAN CROP, HOWEVER, DRY WEATHER NEEDED TO SEED WHEAT AND DRY OUT CORN TO GET FALL HARVEST UNDERWAY.
