## Pennsylvania's Finest Breeding Hogs Shine At Show, Sale

LEBANON (Lebanon Co.) — Pork producers from around the state came with their finest boars and gilts to Lebanon County to compete in the first Yorkshire, Hampshire, Duroc breeding show and sale. Several father and son duos earned top honors in the competition.

Jim and Gus Parlett of Airville led the Duroc contest with a couple

of Hill Top produce. Judge Henry Holloway of Darlington, Md., chose a February Hill Top son to be the champion Duroc boar. The champion is out of TM Fanny 2-1 and is a littermate to the top-selling gilt at the '89 Indiana State Fair.

The Parletts' other Hill Top champion is an October '88 bred gilt out of TM Belle.

Nabbing the champion Duroc open gilt title was an entry from

Ken Fetterolf of Centre Hall. His gilt is a January LD8 Flatbush daughter out of Diesel 10-3. The gilt is a littermate to the second-place gilt at the Ohio State Fair.

Ken Winebark of Lebanon added another win to his string with an open Hampshire gilt. His champion February Adidas daughter is out of Colts Belle 26-2, who is a littermate to the Farm Show's highest-selling Hampshire gilt. Adidas was the 1987 Barrow Show Champion, and the gilt is a littermate to the reserve champion boar of the '89 Ohio State Fair.

A Smoke 4-1 daughter was the champion Hampshire bred gilt showed by Lee Bixler and family of Four Oaks Farm in York Springs. The gilt is out of Cora 8-9, a Cal daughter.

Showing the champion and reserve champion Hampshire boars was a father-son pair from Annville. Charlie and Daryl Bomgardner of Blue Mountain View Farms exhibited the January boys that caught judge Holloway's eye. Charlie's boar, a Classic son out of Miss Buster was named champion, while Daryl's George son out of Werewolf was reserve. George sired last year's Keystone International Livestock Exposition top-cutting Hampshire, and Werewolf is Daryl's youth project.

Another father-son combination took top honors in the Yorkshire open gilt competition. Charlie Hall of Julian ran a January LLA7 Ultra daughter before the judge, who named her champion. Daryl Bomgardner of Annville entered the top bid of \$320 for the gilt, making it the event's top-selling open gilt.

Taking the reserve championship Yorkshire title was Mark Hall's February PSU7 Step Up 1-5 daughter out of CBH7 Pride.

Leon Arnold of Lebanon exhibited the champion Yorkshire bred gilt, a September '88 daughter of Ultra out of Lucy 63-2. The gilt is bred to Puff, who Arnold purchased at the first Rural Pork Expo in Des Moines. Lucy has had four litters and farrowed 51 piglets of which 50 were weaned. Arnold's champion was the show's top-selling bred gilt and sold for \$500 to Keith Martin of Hamstead, Md.

The champion Yorkshire boar was led out by Jack Clark of Hustontown. The hog is a January son of WGW7 Stetson out of JES8 Miss Toto. Mountain View Farm of Fayetteville must have liked the boar as it paid \$750 for it, making it the show's top-selling boar.

A total of 69 head were shown and sold for \$13,350. A partial list of the results follows.
