RAINS REPLEN-ISHING SOIL MOISTURE MANY PLACES TO IMPROVE PROSPECTS FOR 1990 CROPS. TALKS THAT U.S.D.A. MAY ALLOW 110 PERCENT WHEAT ALLOTMENT FOR NEXT YEAR.
