WEEKLY REVIEW IN VIRGINIA MARKETS IN REVIEW; SEPT. 7-13, 1989. FEEDER STEERS AND HEIFERS IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$4.00 LOWER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$1.50-4.00 LOWER.

SLAUGHTER STEERS AND HEIFERS IN VIRGINIA WERE MIXED \$1.00 HIGHER TO \$1.00 LOWER IN A LIGHT TEST. IN THE MIDWEST THEY WERE \$1.00-1.50 LOWER.

COWS AND BULL PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$6.00 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$1.00 HIGHER. BEEF PRODUCTION WAS 15% BELOW A WEEK AGO AND 10% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 6 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.

VEAL AND CALF PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE NOT TESTED AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE MOSTLY STEADY. VEAL AND CALF PRODUCTION WAS 10% BELOW A WEEK AGO AND 10% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 9 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.

LAMB PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$1.00 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$1.00 TO \$3.00 LOWER. LAMB PRODUCTION WAS 5% BELOW A WEEK AGO AND 7% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 1 POUNDS LIGHTER THAN A YEAR AGO.

SLAUGHTER HOG PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE \$2.50-3.00 LOWER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$2.25-3.00 LOWER. FRESH PORK PRICES WERE

MIXED, \$9.00 LOWER TO \$3.00 HIGHER. PORK PRODUCTION WAS 10% BELOW A WEEK AGO BUT 3% ABOVE A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 1 POUND HEAVIER THAN A YEAR AGO.

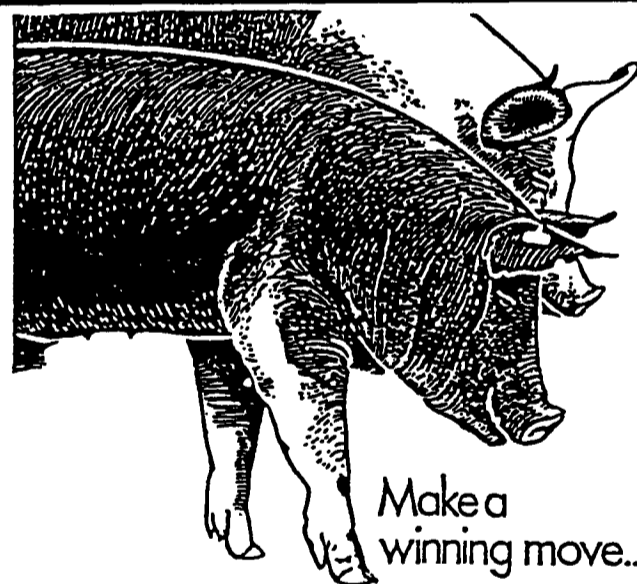
