### ACRES CORN UPDATE:

Corn futures prices improved today and ended the session from unchanged on the deferred July and September options to 1-1/4 cent higher on the December. Price improvement came on buying tied to weather predictions calling for a chance of frost this weekend in the upper midwest. Further support was attributed to rumors that the USSR had purchased 60,000 metric tonnes of U.S. corn gluten meal. Korea purchased 100,000 metric tonnes of corn overnight with Taiwan passing on 31,000 metric tonnes. Sep-

tember expired quietly this afternoon at \$2.34-1/2 after trading in a range from \$2.30 to \$2.39. December settled at \$2.28-1/2, up 1-1/4 cent.

**ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE:** Soybean futures prices closed higher today from 5-1/4 to 7 cents on buying tied to the latest weather forecasts calling for frost this weekend in the northern parts of the belt. Further bearish weather news came in the form of "Hugo" which is now expected to make landfall by Saturday on the coast of Georgia. This would

bring heavy rainfall and possible damage to the immature crop. Gains were held in check by the impending harvest. September expired quietly today at \$5.68-1/4 gaining 5-1/4 cents for the day. November closed 7 cents higher at \$5.75-1/2 after trading in a range from \$5.72 to \$5.77.

**ACRES WHEAT UPDATE:** Wheat futures prices closed from unchanged to 1-1/2 cents higher this afternoon following a day of featureless trading. Buying was attributed mainly to spillover from
