FUTURES MARKET TRENDS GRAIN AND LIVESTOCK

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ACRES CORN UPDATE:
Corn futures prices closed from 1/2 cent higher to 1-1/2 cents lower this afternoon after a day of narrow range trading. Opening pressure was in response to "sell the fact" trading after yesterday's announcement of a sale of 2 million metric tonnes to the USSR. Additional sales were tied to slack commercial demand and reports of good harvest progress. Losses were partially offset by news of light farmer sales and hopes that

the USSR would make further purchases. After the close the USDA announced sales of 200,000 metric tonnes to the Soviet Union along with news that 200,000 metric tonnes was slated for shipment to Poland. December ended today's session 1-1/2 cents lower at \$2.39 after trading in a range from \$2.38-1/2 to \$2.41-1/2.

ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE: Soybean futures prices

settled from 1-3/4 cents lower on the August option to 1 cent higher on the deferred November. Today's closes were at or near session lows with the front months higher throughout most of the session and falling in the closing minutes on commercial hedge pressure. Prices were higher this morning on reports of higher basis levels and whispers of export interest from Taiwan and Norway. November settled 1/4 cent higher
