

## Crawford County 4-H's Place In Junior Show

MEADVILLE (Crawford Co.) — Fifty-five Crawford County 4-H Dairy project animals competed in the 34th Pennsylvania Junior Dairy Show held at the Farm Show Building, Harrisburg, PA, on September 25, 1989. A total of 996 4-H and FFA project animals in all six dairy breeds were catalogued to compete in the state judging. These 4-H and FFA project animals had received blue ribbons at their local roundups held in their respective counties throughout the state. ## Yeutter Seeks National Dairy Board Nominees

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Secretary of Agriculture Clayton Yeutter today asked dairy producer and other farm organizations certified by the U.S. Department of Agriculture to nominate candidates to succeed 12 members of the National Dairy Promotion and Research Board whose terms expire April 30, 1990.

Yeutter will appoint 12 from those nominated to serve three-year terms beginning May 1, 1990, and ending April 30, 1993.

Members whose terms expire April 30 are Manuel Santos Jr., Tulare, Calif. (region 2); Ruth E. Miller, Kuna, Idaho (region 3); Ivan K. Strickler, Iola, Kan. (region 4); Leslie R. Winters, Bingham Lake, Minn. (region 5); Daniel J. Rodenkirch, Kewaskum, Wis. (region 6); Gerald R. Sipple, Menominee, Wis. (region 6); G. Joe Lyon, Toledo, Iowa (region 7); Ruth M. Robinson, Jonesborough, Tenn. (region 8); Herman M. Brubaker, West Alexandria, Ohio (region 9); Walter A. Martz, Frederick, Md. (region 11); Carl E. Butler, Pine Plains, N.Y. (region 12); and Leo O'Brien, Jr., South Burlington, Vt. (region 13).

All of the above members,

except Ruth Miller and Leo O'Brien, have served two terms and are not eligible for renomination. The two exceptions are eligible for renomination since they have not served two terms. No terms for regions 1 (Washington and Oregon) and 10 (Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia) expire in 1990.

The National Dairy Promotion and Research Board was established under the Dairy and Tobacco Adjustment Act of 1983 to develop and administer a coordinated program of promotion,

research and nutrition education. The 36-member board of milk producers is authorized to design programs to strengthen the dairy industry's position in domestic and foreign markets.

The National Program is financed by a mandatory 15-cent per hundredweight assessment on all milk marketed commercially

by dairymen in the contiguous 48 states.
