

Am. Ag Movement To Sue Chicago Board Of Trade

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The American Agriculture Movement, Inc. voted to file a lawsuit against the Chicago Board of Trade. AAM, Inc. National President Harvey Joe Sanner said "This is another necessary step in our history of acting on behalf of the family farmers who make up our membership."

This legal action was necessitated by the July 11 order of the CBOT Board of Directors that July soybean contracts be liquidated causing a sudden drop in soybean prices. Several knowledgeable sources have indicated that a significant price increase for 1989 crop soybeans was sacrificed, costing farmers millions of dollars.

David Senter, AAM National Director said "After weeks of study and research AAM, Inc. felt there was no other course of action except to seek damages in the judicial system."

The suit will be filed as soon as possible and will allow soybean farmers that were affected to seek recovery of damages.

David Senter was heard to say "Producers of practically all commodities have a stake in this litigation, when one commodity is adversely affected it impacts others. This will be an opportunity for all producers and others that are concerned with our marketing system to have those concerns addressed."

Sanner went on to say "We should probably thank the Board for providing us with this opportunity. After protests, hearings, F.B.I. investigations, and indictments of traders may have caused the angry frustration to mount. To calm the fears of those who accuse AAM, Inc. of trying to destroy the Board of Trade, it is not so. We know that there must be integrity in our marketing system. But it

Maryland Team National 4-H Dairy Judging Champ

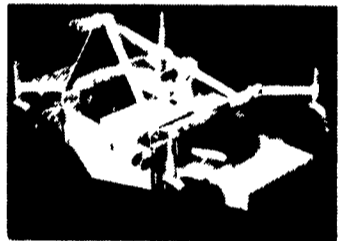

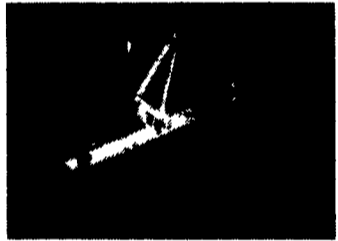

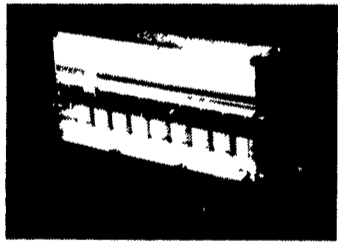

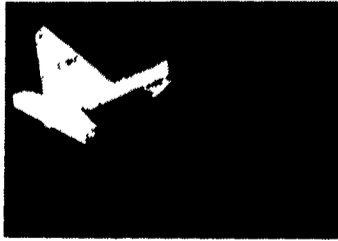

was not farmers nor AAM that destroyed integrity and our lawsuit may be the healthiest thing for the market and the producers," said Sanner. "The injunctive section of the suit seeks to prohibit the Chicago Board of Trade from repeating this type action again. It should also be said that it wasn't farmers who were dual trading or indicted by the F.B.I. It was not farmers who caused soybean markets to plunge downward and it was not AAM or farmers who prohibited by being short in the market, as some firms did. It was not us who had a windfall when soybean prices fell because of the ruling made by the Board of Directors of the CBOT. Quite frankly, the Board has done a

lousy job in the integrity department. Our suit might let a little sunlight into the "pits" on Lasalle Street."

David Senter concluded by saying "Why does the Board of Trade believe in "FREE TRADE" only when it applies to everyone else, but when it comes to themselves they manipulate the market?"
