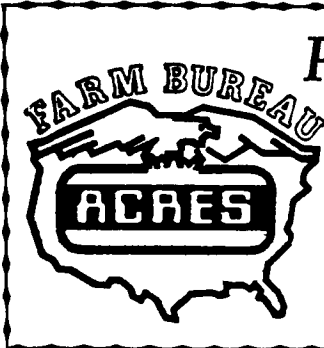

FUTURES MARKET TRENDS GRAIN AND LIVESTOCK

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Acres Corn Update: Corn futures settled from 1/4 to 1-3/4 cents higher on late short covering and commercial buying tied to cash-connected demand. Further support was tied to pre-report positioning and firmer basis levels along with reports of slack producer sales despite good harvest progress. Pre-release estimates for this week's USDA Crop Report, which is scheduled for release at 3:00 p.m. CDT tomorrow, came in at 7.399 billion bushels which compares with the September USDA estimate of 7.321 billion bushels. December corn settled today at \$2.35, up 1-3/4 cents, after trading in a range from \$2.33-1/4 to \$2.35-1/4. Bids for generic certificates were mostly steady.

Acres Soybean Update: Soybeans futures prices closed from

unchanged to 3 cents higher but off session highs on late sales tied to the collapse of soyoil. Price support on the opening was in response to oversold indicators and light pre-report short covering. Pre-report estimates are putting production at 1.919 billion bushels which is up slightly from the USDA September figure of 1.889 billion bushels. Contract lows were touched today shortly before the close with November settling unchanged at \$5.52-1/4 after trading in a range from \$5.51 to \$5.57.

Acres Wheat Update: Wheat futures prices lost from 1/4 to 2-3/4 cents this afternoon on selling tied to cash market weakness and news that bids by Algeria and Turkey for export bonus had been rejected. Opening pressure was tied to disappointment over less than expected export

inspections last week with light commercial buying limiting losses. Volume for the day was light with December settling 2-3/4 cents lower at \$4.04-1/4 after trading in a range from \$4.03 to \$4.07. July lost only 1/4 cent, settling at \$3.54-3/4.

Acres Cattle Update: Live and feeder cattle futures settled higher gaining late in the session on buying in response to reports of active fed cattle sales at higher prices. Reports of \$72.00 for top steers in Western Kansas fueled buying along with expectations for higher beef cut out values after yesterday's higher quotes. Prices were confined to narrow range trading because many traders felt the premium to cash had already been factored in the strong fed trade along with general hesitan-
