GRAIN PRICES MIXED ON WEDNESDAY. REJECTION OF SEVERAL EXPORT BONUS TENDERS WEIGHED ON WHEAT PRICES. CORN PRICES HIGHER SUPPORTED BY SHORT COVERINGS AND AN ACTIVE HARVEST PACE THROUGHOUT THE MIDWEST. WIDESPREAD SHORT COVERINGS AND POSITION EVENING BEFORE U.S.D.A.'S CROP REPORT, SCHEDULED FOR RELEASE THURSDAY, BOOSTED SOYBEAN PRICES.

UNITED STATES...RAIN CONTINUED TO SLOW CROP HARVESTS IN THE EAST. HARVEST PROGRESSED WELL IN MOST OF THE CORN BELT, GREAT PLAINS, AND THE WEST. IN THE DELTA, WET FIELD CONDITIONS SLOWED CROP HARVESTS EARLY IN THE WEEK. SOIL MOISTURE WAS MOSTLY ADEQUATE TO SURPLUS IN THE DELTA AND THE EAST, ADEQUATE TO SHORT IN THE CORN BELT, AND SHORT TO ADEQUATE IN MOST OF THE GREAT PLAINS AND WEST. WINTER WHEAT PLANTING WAS 71 PERCENT COMPLETE. NINETY-TWO PERCENT OF THE CORN CROP WAS MATURE AND HARVEST WAS 27 PERCENT COMPLETE. SOYBEAN HARVEST WAS 38 PERCENT COMPLETE. SORGHUM HARVEST WAS 37 PERCENT COMPLETE. WESTERN USSR...WIDESPREAD PRECIPITATION DELAYS LATE SEASON SUMMER CROP HARVESTING. BELOW-NORMAL TEMPERATURES SLOW EARLY GROWTH OF WINTER

GRAINS. IN THE NEW LANDS, UNSEASONABLY WARM, DRY WEATHER HELPS LATE HARVEST EFFORTS. EUROPE...COOL TEMPERATURES SLOW EARLY GROWTH OF WINTER GRAINS IN THE EAST. LIGHT RAIN IN THE WEST-CAUSES ONLY MINOR FALL FIELDWORK DELAYS. SOUTH ASIA...SCATTERED SHOWERS CONTINUE IN THE SOUTH AND EAST. EASTERN ASIA...DRYNESS FAVORS FALL CROP HARVEST ACROSS THE NORTH CHINA PLAIN. TYPHOON BRIAN BRUSHES TAIWAN AND SOUTHERN CHINA. SOUTHEAST ASIA...TYPHOON ANGELA STRIKES THE NORTHERN PHILIPPINES. SHOWERS RETURN TO THAILAND'S GRAIN REGIONS. SOUTH AMERICA...WETNESS PERSISTS IN SOUTHERN BRAZIL. DRYNESS CONTINUES IN WESTERN CROP AREAS OF ARGENTINA. WHEAT RANGES FROM MATURE IN NORTHERN GRAIN AREAS OF BRAZIL TO LATE VEGETATIVE GROWTH IN SOUTHERN CROP AREAS OF ARGENTINA. CANADA...DRY BUT COLD WEATHER COVERS THE CANADIAN PRAIRIES.
