## **EBDC Fungicides Partially Removed From Market**

EBDC fungicides, better known in the trade as maneb, mancozeb, and zineb, were partially withdrawn from the market effective January 1, 1990. The four manufacturers of the fungicides, Du-Pont, Pennwalt, Rohm & Haas, and BASF, will seek to retain the label for only 13 crops.

Rohm & Haas intends to retain the following crops on its DITHANE (mancozeb) label: asparagus, bananas, cranberries, grapes, onions, peanuts, potatoes, sugarbeets, sweet corn, tomatoes, and wheat. This action also will affect the Rohm & Haas products DIKAR fungicide-miticide. Cur-

rently registered seed treatment and turf-ornamental uses will be maintained.

DuPont still will register its mancozeb product, MANZATE 200, on the following crops: asparagus, bananas, cranberries, grapes, onions, peanuts, popcorn, potatoes, sweet corn, sugarbeets, tomatoes, wheat, turf ornamentals, and seed treatment.

The action announced by Rohm & Haas was effective as of September 6, 1989. Other companies have made similar changes. Experts expect these manufacturer to start producing products with new

labels immediately. This action by no means guarantees the future uses of mancozeb on those crops retained. The Environmental Protection Agency could cancel additional or all remaining uses of the EBDC fungicides pending final outcome of the special review process.


