BERWICK (Columbia Co.) -The 4-H beef and lamb sale at Bloomsburg Fair netted \$19,000, enriching the college funds and bank accounts of many area young people. While the average price of beef was down, lamb prices were up by 8 cents per pound compared to last year.

Todd Laudenslager topped the lamb sale with his 102-pound grand champion, which brought \$3.25 per pound. John Fritz of Sunset Ice Cream in Williamsport was high bidder.

Laudenslager, 18, of Northumberland County, has been in Lick-Kill 4-H for seven years. He is the son of Lynn and Dixie Laudenslager.

Todd and his brother, Troy, buy lambs from their father each year, raise them as 4-H projects, then Fair. Their father, Lynn, maintains a flock of 90 ewes.

Todd is a senior at Line Mountain School and is hoping to study ag Business at Cornell. Profits from his lamb sales will help finance his education.

The 110-pound reserve grand champion lamb, owned and shown by Luke Zerby of Snyder County, was bought for \$1.25 per pound by Ryan Jewelers of Danville.

Jon Hummel's grand champion market steer brought \$1.25 per pound. Robert Dent, Dent Plumbing and Heating, Lightstreet was high bidder.

This is Jon's third year in 4-H. It is the second consecutive year this 10-year-old from Sunbury has shown a grand champion market steer.


Young Hummel is saving for college with his 4-H profits.


