South Mountain Community Club.



Adams County. 4-H members participated at the 1989 Keystone Stockman's Contest held at the Farm Show Complex on October 9. Team one placed fifth in the contest which had more than 100 teams competing from seven states. The team members and their scores were: Jason Boyer, East Berlin, 639 points; Jamie Boyer, East Berlin, 646 points; Dan Ludwig, Gettysburg, 587 points; and Seth Small, New Oxford, 487 points. Each team member received \$15 prize money provided by the Pennsylvania Livestock Producers Association. The team total was 1,872. The first-place team was Spotswood FFA with 2,112 points.
