Prices edged higher on whole eggs whites and were sharply higher on yolks. Demand for yolks usually exceeded availability as breakers worked reduced schedules and were not anxious to separate. Raw materials were confidently held and generally met with resistance. Floor stocks were otherwise in fair balance with needs with most breakers cautious and unwilling to replace inventories at current price levels.
