WEEKLY REVIEW IN VIRGINIA MARKETS IN REVIEW; NOV.16-22,1989. FEEDER STEERS AND HEIFERS IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$2.00 LOWER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$2.00 HIGHER.

THERE WERE NO SLAUGHTER STEERS AND HEIFERS IN VIRGINIA THIS WEEK, MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$1.50 HIGHER.

COWS AND BULLS IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE MOSTLY STEADY. BEEF PRODUCTION WAS 2% ABOVE A WEEK AGO AND 5% ABOVE A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 22 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.

THERE WERE NO VEAL PRICES IN VIRGINIA, BUT CALF PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE \$2.00 LOWER. VEAL AND CALF PRODUCTION WAS 2% ABOVE A WEEK AGO AND 6% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 6 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN A YEAR AGO.

LAMB PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE 25 CENT TO \$3.00 LOWER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$2.00 HIGHER. LAMB PRODUCTION WAS 3% ABOVE A WEEK AND 19% ABOVE A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 1 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN A YEAR AGO.

SLAUGHTER HOG PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$1.00 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$1.00 LOWER. FRESH PORK PRICES WERE \$1.50-3.00 LOW-

ER EXCEPT SKINNED HAMS WERE \$3.00-5.00 HIGHER. PORK PRODUCTION WAS 7% HIGHER THAN A WEEK AGO BUT 3% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 3 POUNDS LIGHTER THAN A YEAR AGO.

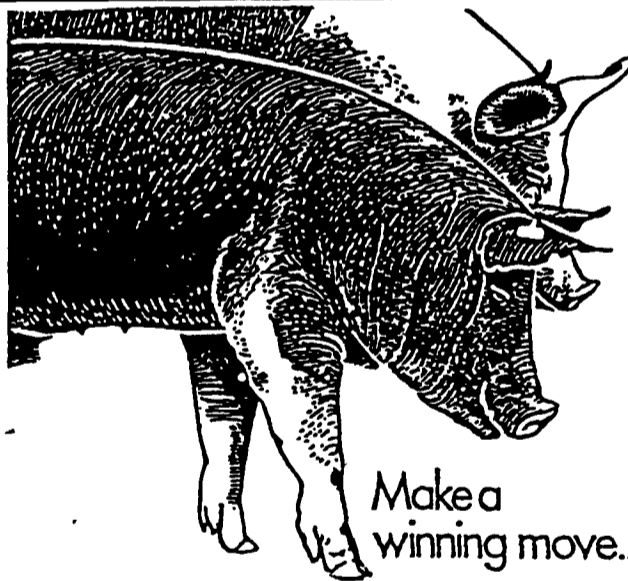
