With increasing urban development, everyone is more aware than ever of the fragile preciousness of our nation's farmland. It is up to a very select group of individuals - yes; farmers; to efficiently manage and protect this valuable

According to Peter Zakanycz, district conservationist for Northampton County, "It is important that any landowner who does not have a conservation plan contact his or her local Soil Conservation Service office before January 1, 1990 in order to maintain eligibility for USDA farm program benefits. Farmers have until December 31, 1994 to implement the conservation plan."


