

Widemanns Named To NMPF Advisory Council

SOUTHAMPTON (Bucks Co.) - Mildred L. and James L. Widmann, Oxford, were elected to serve a one-year term on the National Milk Producers Federation (NMPF) Young Cooperator Advisory Council, it was announced Nov. 27 at the organization's annual meeting in Nashville, Tenn.

The Young Cooperator Advisory Council is responsible for planning and overseeing the National Young Cooperator program, which is held in conjunction with NMPF's annual meeting. The three-day program is designed for dairy farm couples under age 36.

Sponsored by Atlantic Dairy Cooperative, the Widmanns were elected to represent Region 1, which includes dairy cooperatives in the Northeast. They are among 10 couples selected from the Council's five geographic regions.


The Widmanns, who farm 219 acres and milk 50 Guernsey cows, earned their NMPF trip by placing second in Atlantic's 1989 Young Cooperator Contest. They currently are serving a three-year term on Atlantic's Young Cooperator Consultant Committee.


