### LIFETIME PRODUCTION RECORDS

Lifetime production certificates are issued for those cows who have produced at least 100,000 pounds of milk and 3,000 pounds of butterfat or at least 4,000 pounds of butterfat if milk is below 100,000 pounds.

To be issued, records must have been completed and processed at Penn State by October 17, 1989. No new lifetime certificate is issued if a cow does not advance from one thousand pound level to another (ex. 3279 to 3968) except where a cow leaves the herd and it is her final lactation. Lifetime production certificates are issued courtesy of the Pennsylvania Dairyman's Association.

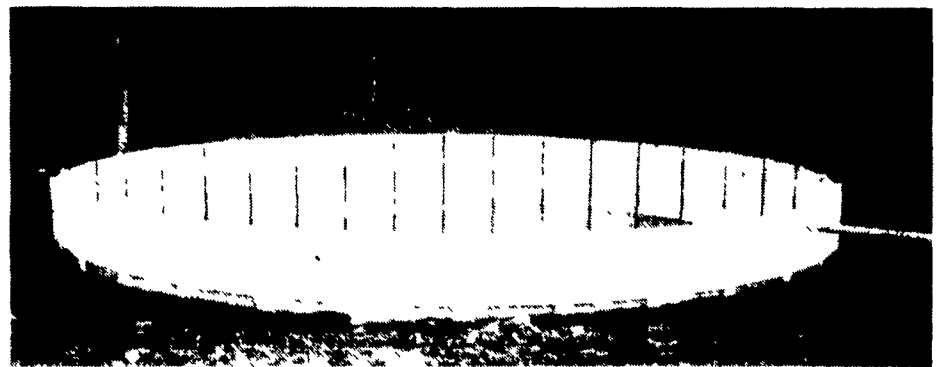
