BULK FEEDER SUPPLY THIS WEEK 550-850 LB. MEDIUM AND LARGE FRAME 1 AND MIXED 1-2 STEERS AND HEIFERS. WEIGH-UP CONDITIONS BASICALLY AVERAGE. NUMEROUS CATTLE CARRYING THIN TO MODERATELY THIN FLESH. THESE COMING OFF WHEAT PASTURE PREMATURELY AS LACK OF MOISTURE IN SEVERAL AREAS OF OKLAHOMA PREVENTED HOLDING CATTLE LONGER. BITTER COLD WEATHER; CALF NUMBERS LIMITED, ONLY A FEW OPERATORS WILLING TO SELL OR BUY CALVES UNDER THESE CONDITIONS. SLAUGHTER COWS AND BULLS \$2.00-\$3.00 HIGHER. COW & BULL DEMAND VERY GOOD. VERY SHARP ADVANCES ON COW AND BULL CARCASSES OVER THE PAST TWO WEEKS SUPPORTED THE UPTURN ON LIVE SALES. COUNTRY BUYERS TAKING OVER HALF OF TOTAL COW NUMBERS. 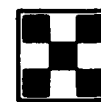
