
Champion Charolais At NAILE

Lancaster County Tobacco Management

Meeting, Show Set

LANCASTER (Lancaster Co.) - A tobacco management meeting and show will be held on Wednesday, January 3, 1990 at the Lancaster County Farm and Home Center from 11 a.m. to 3:15 p.m. The meeting is sponsored by Penn State Extension and will be held in the basement meeting room. Interested tobacco growers are invited to attend the educational meeting and participate in the show.

A variety of interesting topics related to tobacco management will be discussed to assist tobacco growers produce a quality crop. Starting at 11:15 a.m., John Yocum from the Penn State Research Farm will be discussing weed control in tobacco. At 1 p.m. Dr. Arvydas Grybauskas from the University of Maryland will be discussing tobacco diseases and how to control them. Following Dr. Grybauskas, the tobacco outlook, Pa., national, and world will be discussed by Verner Grise, U.S.D.A. Economic Research Service. Dr. Grise traces tobacco markets throughout the world along with monitoring the planting and harvesting of the world's tobacco crops. Claude McKee, University of Maryland, tobacco specialist, will be discussing the tobacco industry in Maryland. Claude and John Yocum have had several joint research projects and will have some interesting data to share with growers.

The program will qualify for several pesticide update training

credits.

In addition to the tobacco management meeting, the Lancaster County Tobacco Show will be held at the same time. The tobacco show has both open classes and FFA classes for Pennsylvania

Type 41 and Pennsylvania Smoking Type Tobacco (Normally referred to as Maryland Tobacco by local growers). Anyone who would like to enter an exhibit in the show should contact Bob Anderson, Lancaster County Extension Office for more details.

Lunch will be on your own at one of the local restaurants from approximately 12 to 1 p.m. or you can bring a lunch along.
