

# National 4-H Honors

**4-H SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS Fashion Revue** — Heather D. Corson, 17, of Braddock Heights (Frederick County) was one of four 4-H members from across the nation to receive \$1,000 scholarship awards for excellence in the fashion revue project. Maryland also had a national winner in this project area last year. Sponsoring organizations both years were the Viking White Sewing Machine Company and Simplicity Pattern Co., Inc.

Heather has organized her county's 4-H fashion show for the past three years. She has planned and conducted fashion workshops for other 4-H members, and she has earned considerable money from professional modeling. Inspired by her study of Italian clothing design during an International 4-H Youth Exchange program, she has begun designing her own clothes.

**Gardening & Horticulture** — Heidi L. Glisan, 17, of New London (Frederick County) was one of five 4-H members from across the nation to receive \$1,000 scholarships from the Ortho Consumer Products Division of the Chevron Chemical Company for excellence in gardening and horticulture programs.

As part of her 4-H work, Heidi has made an extensive study of dahlia culture and has developed skills in floral design. She has also studied the culture of dish gardens, cactus gardens and terrariums. She has conducted horticulture workshops for other 4-H members.

**Dairy** — Jenell R. Rinehart, 16, of Taneytown (Carroll County) was one of six 4-H members from across the nation to receive \$1,000 scholarships from Land O' Lakes, Inc., and the American Cyanamid Company for excellence in the 4-H dairy program.

As part of her project, Jenell is responsible for managing a milking herd of 85 Holstein cows. She has won both the junior and senior championships in 4-H dairy cattle judging at the Maryland State Fair, and she was a member of the Maryland team which won the national 4-H dairy cattle judging championship on Oct. 3 at Madison, Wis.

Jenell has organized food and blood drives in her school, and she has produced a "cow" puppet show to entertain senior citizens and inform younger 4-H members about the 4-H dairy project.

In addition to her dairy skills, Jenell is talented in sewing. She won grand champion honors last year in the 4-H Fashion Revue at the Maryland State Fair, and she was a blue-ribbon winner in the same event this year.

**Petroleum Power** — Ernest H. Beck, 17, of Jessup (Howard County) was one of six 4-H members from across the nation to receive \$1,500 scholarships from the Amoco Foundation, Inc., for excellence in the 4-H petroleum power project.

As an outgrowth of his 4-H work, Ernie operates his own small engine business. He has repaired, overhauled and rebuilt riding and push-type lawn mowers, as well as weed-eaters, tillers, chain saws, go-carts and motorcycles.

Ernie was senior 4-H small engines champion at the Maryland State Fair in 1987, and he has taught the basic parts of small engines to a boy with learning disability.

**Sheep** — Michael T. Howell, 19, of Glenelg (Howard County) was

one of four 4-H members from across the nation who received \$1,000 scholarships from the American Sheep Industry Association for excellence in the 4-H sheep program.

Mike also was one of 12 outstanding young persons who received the prestigious 4-H silver tray award, given on behalf of the President of the United States. In addition to the silver tray, he received a \$1,500 scholarship from the Reader's Digest Foundation.

**Career** — Matthew E. Iager, 18, of Fulton (Howard County) was one of six 4-H members from across the nation to receive \$1,000 scholarships from the DeKalb Genetics Corporation for general excellence in 4-H club projects. A Maryland 4-H member also won this award last year.

A senior at Atholton High School in Columbia, Matt plans to attend Delaware Valley College and prepare to qualify for admittance to a school of veterinary medicine.

As part of his 4-H work, Matt assists with the family's 1,100-acre dairy, crop and turkey farm. He has helped to train the county 4-H dairy judging teams; he placed third in the

national 4-H dairy cattle judging contest in 1988, and his team won the national 4-H dairy bowl contest last year.

**Food & Nutrition** — Rebecca A. Segal, 17, of Four Corners (Montgomery County) was one of six 4-H members from across the nation to receive \$1,500 scholarships from Kraft General Foods for excellence in food and nutrition projects.

Becky was runner-up in the senior 4-H food and nutrition demonstration competition this year at the Maryland State Fair with a "calcium-connection" party cheese ring.

As part of her 4-H work, she developed a nutrition and fitness game which she used in an "Exploring 4-H" program for elementary school students. She conducted a nutrition survey at the county fair, helped edit and direct a nutrition video program, and led after-school nutrition workshops.

The national 4-H scholarship winners were selected by representatives of the Cooperative Extension Service at land-grant universities and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Awards are arranged by the National 4-H Council.


