DER Bay Clean-up Campaign At Farm Show

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) --- Say Yes! That's the theme of a new campaign organized by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Resources Chesapeake Bay Education Office encouraging individuals to do their part to improve the quality of water reaching the Chesapeake Bay from the Commonwealth.

In association with the Harrisburg offices of the Alliance for the Chesapeake Bay and the Chesapeake Bay Foundation, the Bay Education Office will display an exhibit outlining simple environmental protection practices at the 1990 Farm Show in Harrisburg.

Because the state contributes more than 50 percent of the freshwater reaching the Chesapeake Bay through the Susquehanna and Potomac Rivers and areas that drain directly into the Bay, Pennsylvanians play an important role in improving the condition of the Chesapeake.

Highlighted by a six-foot lighthouse, the Chesapeake Bay exhibit will invite Pennsylvanians to pledge to implement simple environmental protection activities that can positively affect the Chesapeake Bay and other environmental concerns.

Many of the actions outlined by the exhibit can be done by an individual in his or her own home or office. Some of the suggestions include properly applying lawn

and garden pesticides, contributing to recycling drives, and improving lawn care techniques.

Other items on the pledge list relate directly to agriculture, a source of many of the pollutants harming the Bay today. Possible pledges for farmers include implementing a nutrient management plan on their farms and providing for permanent vegetative cover along streamsides.

Information on the Pennsylvania Chesapcake Bay Program, a cooperative project between the state Department of Environmental Resources and related State and Federal agencies and organizations to reduce nonpoint source pollution from the Commonwealth, will also be available to Farm Show visitors.


