Movement of ready-to-cook whole fryers was generally fair. Supplies were adequate for current needs. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged to higher at ***53-68*** cents. Live supplies were adequate with average live weights in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules for today were heavy. The trade sentiment was steady. In the parts complex, supplies of cutlets were adequate, whole breasts were short of the active buyer interest, legs and leg quarters ranged adequate to fully adequate, and wings were irregular and ranged from close balance to burdensome.
