MARKET COMMENT: TRADE SENTIMENT WAS BARELY STEADY TO WEAK. DEMAND CONTINUED LIGHT TO MODERATE FOR THE READILY AVAILABLE AND AMPLIFIED OFFERING OF LARGE SIZES. MEDIUMS WERE ADEQUATE TO FULLY ADEQUATE OFFERINGS TO BREAKERS INCREASED AT GENERALLY TO UNCHANGED LOWER PRICES.

## Delmarva Broiler Fryer

Jan. 17, 1990

Movement of ready-to-cook whole fryers was generally fair. Supplies were adequate for current needs. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged to higher at \*\*\*53-68\*\*\* cents. Live supplies were adequate with average live weights in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules for today were heavy. The trade sentiment was steady. In the parts complex, supplies of cutlets were adequate, whole breasts were short of the active buyer interest, legs and leg quarters ranged adequate to fully adequate, and wings were irregular and ranged from close balance to burdensome.

Trucklot buying interest was light to fair and generally less aggressive than earlier. Supplies of boneless-skinless breasts continue to clear well; however, late week interest was lighter and offerings were available for earlier next week. Whole breasts remained in light supply, particularly from Delmarva area. White line run breasts were about adequate at current price levels. Legs and leg quarters were readily available despite 39 to 79 cent retail ads and supplies were slow in clearing. Wings were burdensome and most trades were at lower levels.
